

The size of the GA fleet ranges depending upon the parameters for measurement. As a consequence, varying figures can be the source of some confusion.

The CAA General Aviation Strategic Review (GASR), which commenced in 2006, incorporated a study regarding the value of GA¹. This study concluded that there were almost 21,500 GA aircraft in the UK. However, this figure included many aircraft that are inactive for the purposes of that study.

Aircraft that can be described as active and based in the UK must appear on the CAA Register with current valid Certificates of Airworthiness, Permits etc, or be gliders that are currently active and include Foreign Registered Aircraft. The British Gliding Association (BGA) also advises there are an estimated 2,300 gliders that are currently active (which compares with a total of possibly over 5,000 gliders).

The following table is based upon the 2008 PhD thesis¹ which relies upon 2005 data. It can be concluded that there are an estimated 15,500 active GA aircraft (including gliders) in the UK.
